# Koreanspice Viburnum

Koreanspice viburnum is a must if you love fragrance in your garden. Red buds open late March/early April, to pink-changing-to-white, very fragrant flowers, arranged in snowball-like clusters.

It is slow-growing, upright, and rounded. Flowers go to non-showy, blue-black drupes by the end of Summer. birds love them!

Leaves are dark green to 4" long and occasionally are flushed with copper. Fall foliage is usually a dull red, sometimes displays shades of wine-red to burgundy.

Full sun to partial shade with regular water.

Wildlife & pollinator friendly.
