## Prairie Dropseed

Perhaps the most ornamental of the native prairie grasses. It grows in a clumping shape with deep green narrow leaves that arch downward. In July, *Sporobolus heterolepis* sends up numerous stalks with delicate, open panicles shooting up over the clump. In fall, foliage turns a coppery orange color, which later fades to cream.

Easily grown in average, dry to medium, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates wide range of soils, including heavy clays. Prefers dry, rocky soils. Good drought tolerance.
