Gordlinia grandiflora is a rare intergeneric hybrid resulting from a controlled cross between *Franklinia alatamaha* and *Gordonia lasianthus*. Both parent plants are native to the US Southeast. Grows more vigorously and has larger flowers than either parent. *Gordlinia* is semi-evergreen, with orange/red fall foliage. Blooms from July to early fall with 5" flowers with white petals and yellow to orange central stamens. Similar in appearance to *Camellia* and lightly fragrant.

Used in landscaping as both a multi-stem or single trunk form. Requires well draining soil.
