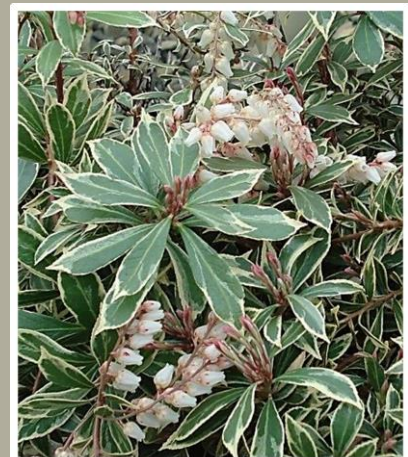




PIERIS JAPONICA

Little Heath

Native to Japan, Pieris 'Little Heath' is a superb flowering and foliage evergreen shrub. Its petite, narrow, foliage is glossy green, edged in silvery white. New growth is rosy pink, which turns merlot in winter. Soft mauve winter flower buds open to white bells in early spring, borne on pendant, terminal panicles up to six inches long. 'Little Heath' prefers partial shade, but will tolerate full sun with adequate watering, and thrives best in the same moist, acidic, well-drained soil as rhododendrons. Its compact size, mounded habit, and multi-seasonal visual interest will make 'Little Heath' a lovely addition to your garden borders, planted en masse, or in a container.

COMMON NAME -- 'Little Heath' Lily of the Valley;
Dwarf Variegated Pieris

USDA HARDINESS -- 6 to 9

10 YEAR SIZE -- 3-4'H x 3-4'W

HABIT -- Symmetrical, open branched, rounded, tidy

CULTURE -- Sun to part shade; acidic, organic soil

- Narrow, evergreen foliage is rich green, outlined in silver
- New foliage is rosy pink; winter foliage turns light merlot
- Soft mauve winter flower buds, open to white bells
- Deer resistant
