Quite possibly the earliest species known to have been cultivated by ancient man, *Ficus carica* delivers both beauty to the landscape, and delicious fruit to the table. Briggs offers two outstanding varieties suitable for cultivation in the Northwest.



FICUS CARICA *'Desert King'*

### **Ficus carica 'Desert King'**

One of the best fig varieties suitable for the Northwest, 'Desert King' is productive and vigorous, growing to about 20 feet. Because it withstands late spring frosts better than most fig cultivars, and ripens in mid-summer, 'Desert King' is an excellent option for gardeners in coastal areas, at higher elevations, or other cooler regions. It makes an ideal container tree in colder climates as well. The large fruit of 'Desert King' is dark green, with very flavorful, strawberry colored flesh. 'Desert King' is delicious eaten fresh or dried, or made into jams and tarts. Zone 7 hardy.



FICUS CARICA *'Olympian'*

### **Ficus carica 'Olympian'**

A very cold-hardy fig, first discovered in Olympia, Washington, 'Olympian' is a unique heirloom variety that produces well in cool and coastal climates. It bears fruit at an early age, and has an abundant early first crop. The fruit of 'Olympian' is about the size of a tangerine, with a thin purple skin and very sweet, dark, inner pulp. This award winning fig has proven hardy in the Pacific Northwest (hardy to zone 6), and is a very reliable producer, making it an ideal choice for home gardens in those zones.
