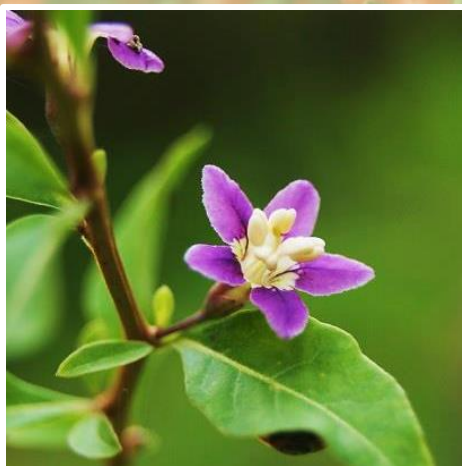


# SUPER FRUIT Goji



High in protein, rich in antioxidants, and a good source of Vitamin C, these little berries pack quite a nutritional punch. It's no wonder Goji berries enjoy super fruit status!



Also known as Wolfberry and Matrimony Vine, Goji berries enjoy super fruit status for the claimed benefits of including them in your diet. Goji berries are high in protein and antioxidants, and are an excellent source of Vitamin C. Berries are preceded in late spring by showy flowers with lavender petals and white eyes. Similar in shape and size to an olive, and produced en masse, Goji berries are bright orangey-red when they ripen in mid/late summer to fall. Goji thrives in sun to partial shade in warm climates, and prefers well drained, alkaline soil. In addition to fruit production, Goji works well as a physical barrier (bramble with thorns), or as an eyesore cover.
