

CREEPING DOGWOOD ▼ COVNUS CANADENSIS ▼ BUNCHBERRY



This spreading, deciduous groundcover is commonly known as Bunchberry or Creeping Dogwood. Bright to medium green, somewhat leathery leaves turn a luxurious merlot in the fall. The cream, sometimes blush pink flowers emerge in late spring to early summer, followed by clusters of fire-truck red berries. Bunchberry prefers cool locations, partial shade, and moist, but well-drained soil, that is rich in organic matter. Cornus canadensis is an excellent naturalizing groundcover for moist areas or woodland garden plant.
