## **Ostrich Fern - *Matteuccia Struthiopteris***

Native to Eastern American woodlands, this deciduous fern forms upright, arching clumps that can reach up to 6ft. It's medium green fronds emerge in spring as fiddle heads then unfurl to finely dissected plumes resembling ostrich feathers. Mass plantings do well in moist, shady woodland sites, wild gardens, and shady borders.

## **New York Fern - *Thelypteris Novaboracensis***

Gracefully arching and finely textured with yellow-green fronds, these ferns grow abundantly in both wetland and dry habitats of the Northeast United States. They often form large colonies that carpet the forest floor. New York ferns are well suited for shady borders, woodland gardens, or planting in masse along streams or ponds in shade or filtered sunlight. They are disease, pest and deer resistant.
