HELLEBORUS PACIFIC FROST



Known to push its flowers up through the snow, this welcome herald of spring is a lovely perennial, that adds color to the shady garden. Though not a true rose, belonging instead to the buttercup family, Helleborus are commonly known as Lenten Rose, as they often flower midwinter, during the Christian season of Lent.

'Pacific Frost' features large, leathery, variegated leaves comprised of three spiny-toothed leaflets, and clusters of creamy green, bowl-shaped flowers, making for a very showy display. The stunning evergreen foliage of 'Pacific Frost' is heavily speckled and stippled with cream or white and pink, and the young shoots are pink.





This is the perfect plant for naturalizing in moist, woodland areas, where it will spread as far as it is allowed. 'Pacific Frost' performs best in regions with a mild maritime climate, planted in part to full shade, in average to moist soils. In colder climates, it should be heavily mulched with leaves around the base of the plant, in very late fall.

- Moist, well-drained alkaline soil that is high in organic matter; part to full shade
