



HELLEBORUS X HYBRIDUS

ROYAL Heritage

*A welcome harbinger of spring,
this easy to grow, winter-blooming
perennial adds color to the landscape
when few plants are blooming.*



Though not a true rose, belonging instead to the buttercup family, Helleborus are commonly known as Lenten Rose, as they often flower mid-winter, during the Christian season of Lent. Developed over many years by noted plants man, John Elsley, Helleborus 'Royal Heritage' features long-lasting, 2 to 3-inch, cup-shaped flowers and leathery, dark green, evergreen foliage. Its nodding blooms come in a wide range of colors that include shades of purple, near-black, pink, white, pale green, yellow, rose and red, some spotted or brushed with contrasting color. Helleborus is low maintenance, tolerant of heat and humidity, thrives in full sun to full shade, and is disease, deer and pest resistant, making it a standout addition to the woodland garden.

USDA HARDINESS: 5 to 9

MATURE SIZE: 15”H x 18”W at 10 years

HABIT: Upright, irregular

CULTURE: Plant in full sun to full shade, in loamy, neutral soil that is moist but well drained

FEATURES:

- Low maintenance, disease/pest free
- Tolerant of heat and humidity
- Long-lasting, nodding, 2 to 3-inch cup-shaped flowers
- Leathery, shiny, dark green foliage
