- Deer resistant
- Very upright habit; 4' to 5'W x 10'H in the Southwest; 3' to 5' in cooler climates
- Prefers alkaline, but tolerates most soils
- Plant in full sun; well-drained soil that is on the dry side
- Low to average fertility
