GAULTHERIA shallon

Native to western North America, Gaultheria shallon is a robust evergreen shrub that will spread to form dense thickets. Though slow-growing, it can reach heights of over 6 ft in shady conditions. Plants in the sun usually grow only to about 3 feet. Its leathery, egg-shaped leaves are very finely serrated, with shiny dark green topsides, and lighter green undersides. In spring to mid-summer, reddish racemes bearing small, urn-shaped pink-white flowers appear, followed by dark blue, edible berries in late summer.

Three distinctive cultivars are available, each bringing a unique twist to this popular plant!
